CCRW's Gubernatorial Forum Huge Success; Reaches Audience of more than 250,000!

As you know, Clark County Republican Women (CCRW) hosted an educational forum featuring all seven Republicans running for Washington Governor on July 9th. This event SOLD OUT and we enjoyed record setting attendance both in person and online!
