### CCRW's Gubernatorial Forum Huge Success; Reaches Audience of more than 250,000!

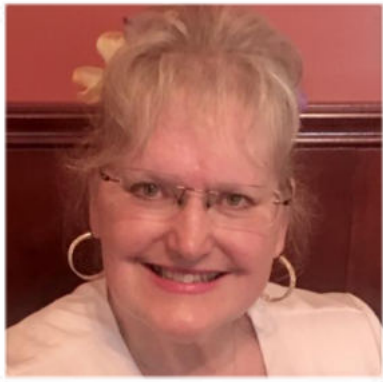
## Treasurer's Message

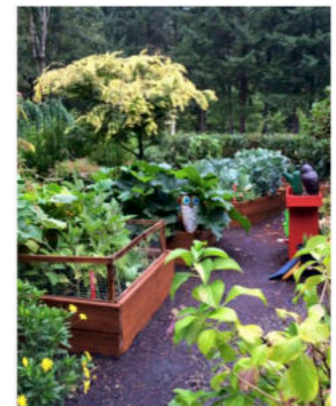
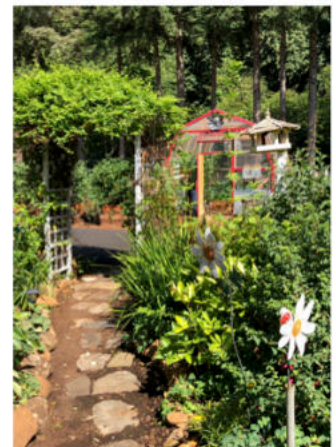
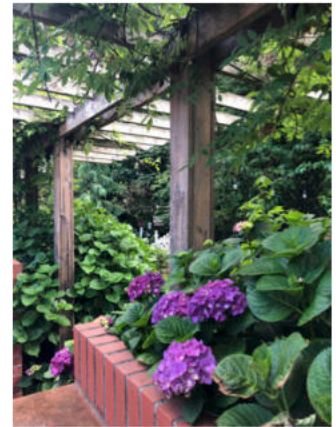
